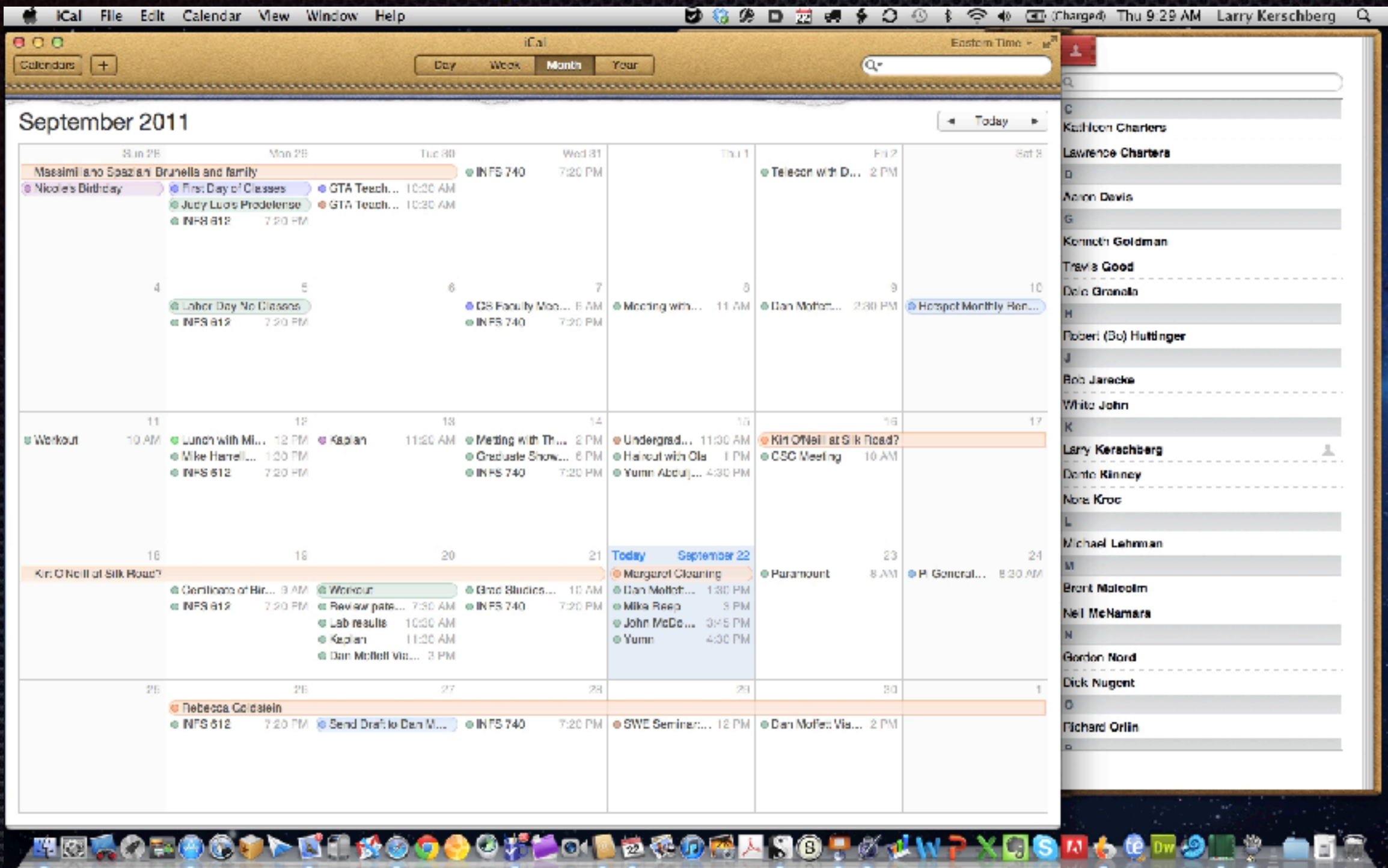


# Lion Features I Love

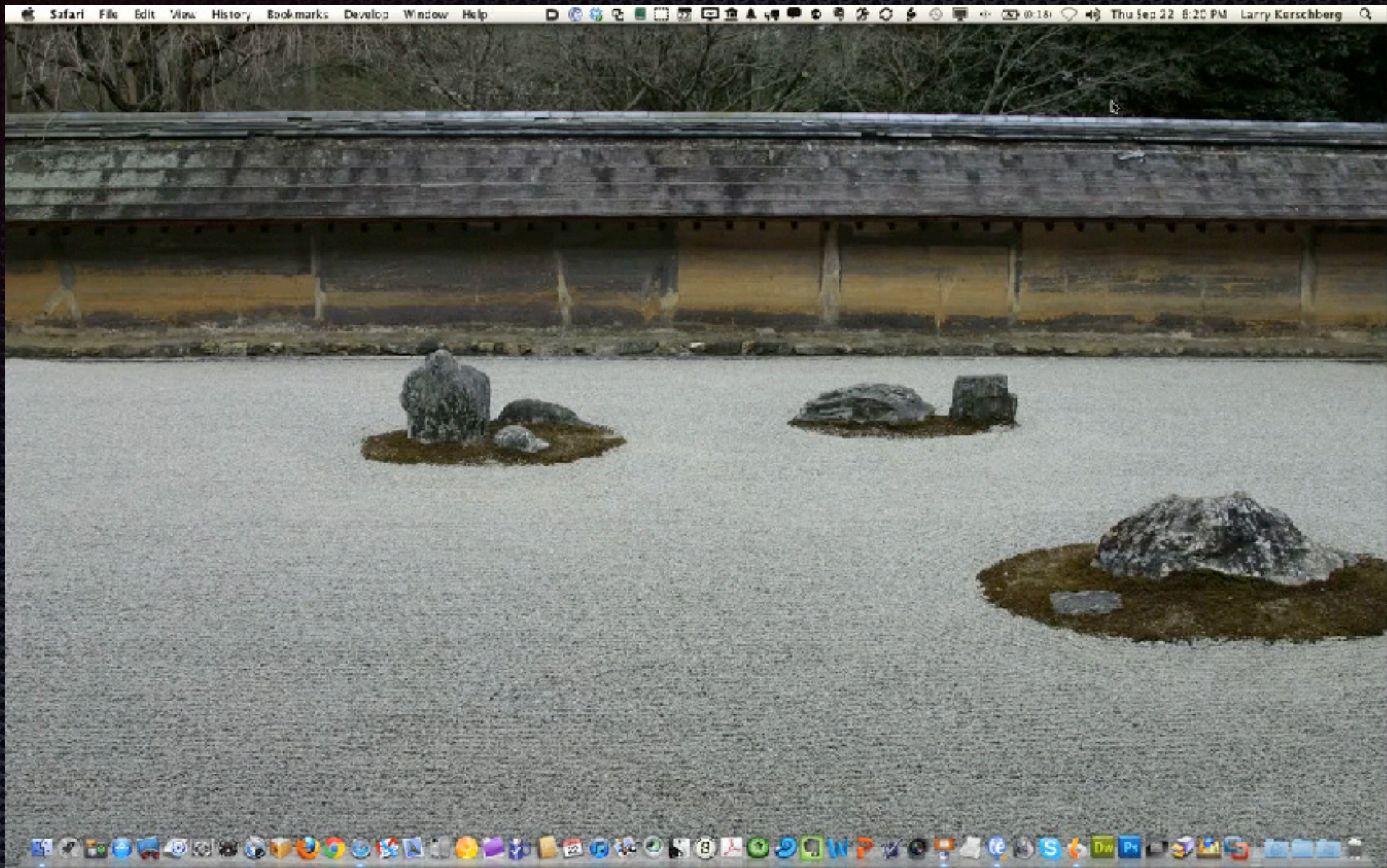


# Mission Control

Combination of Exposé and Spaces;

Easy to assign programs to spaces, create new desktops, use gestures to open Mission Control and to scroll between desktops

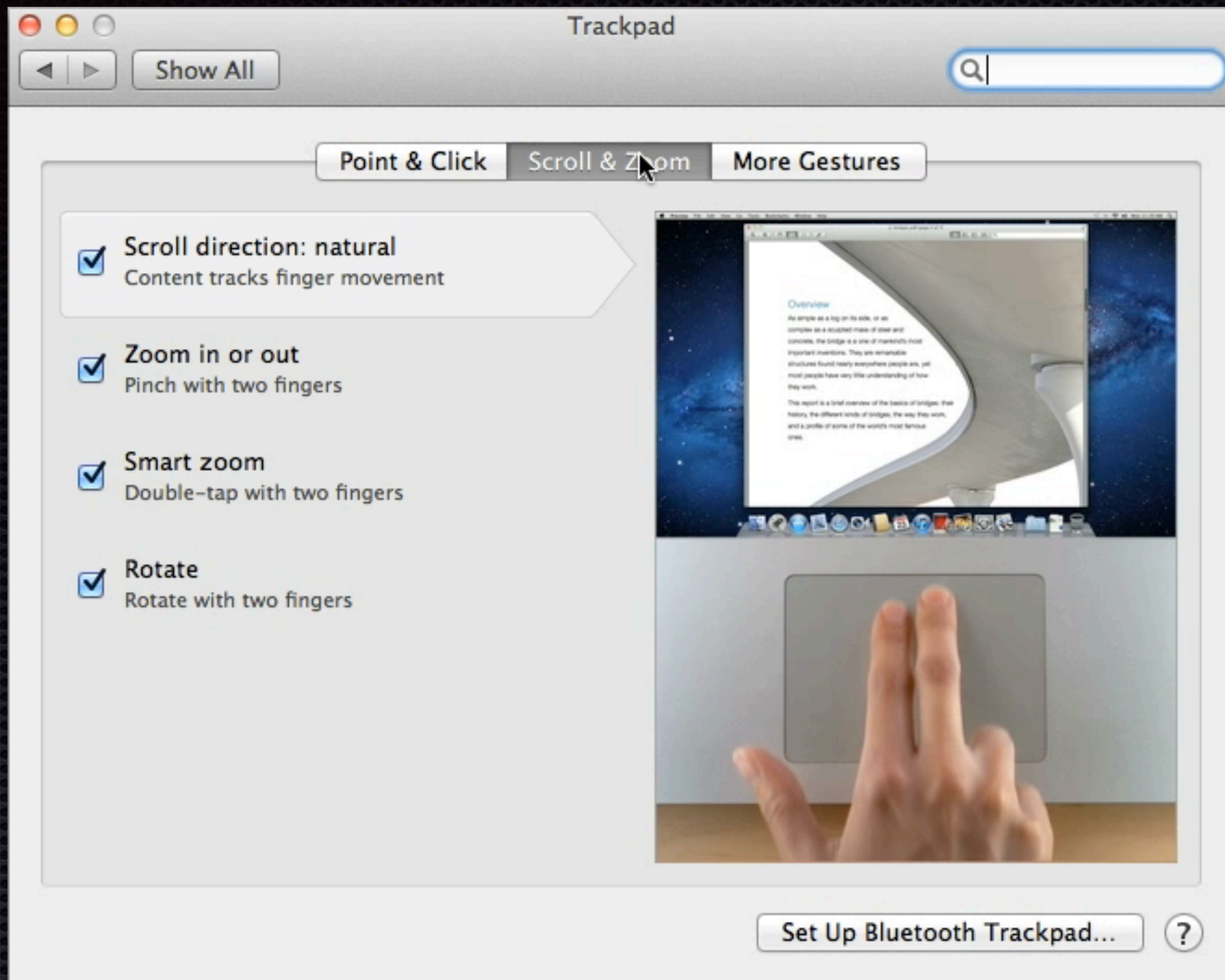




# Launch Pad

Brings the iOS Home Page view for your applications.

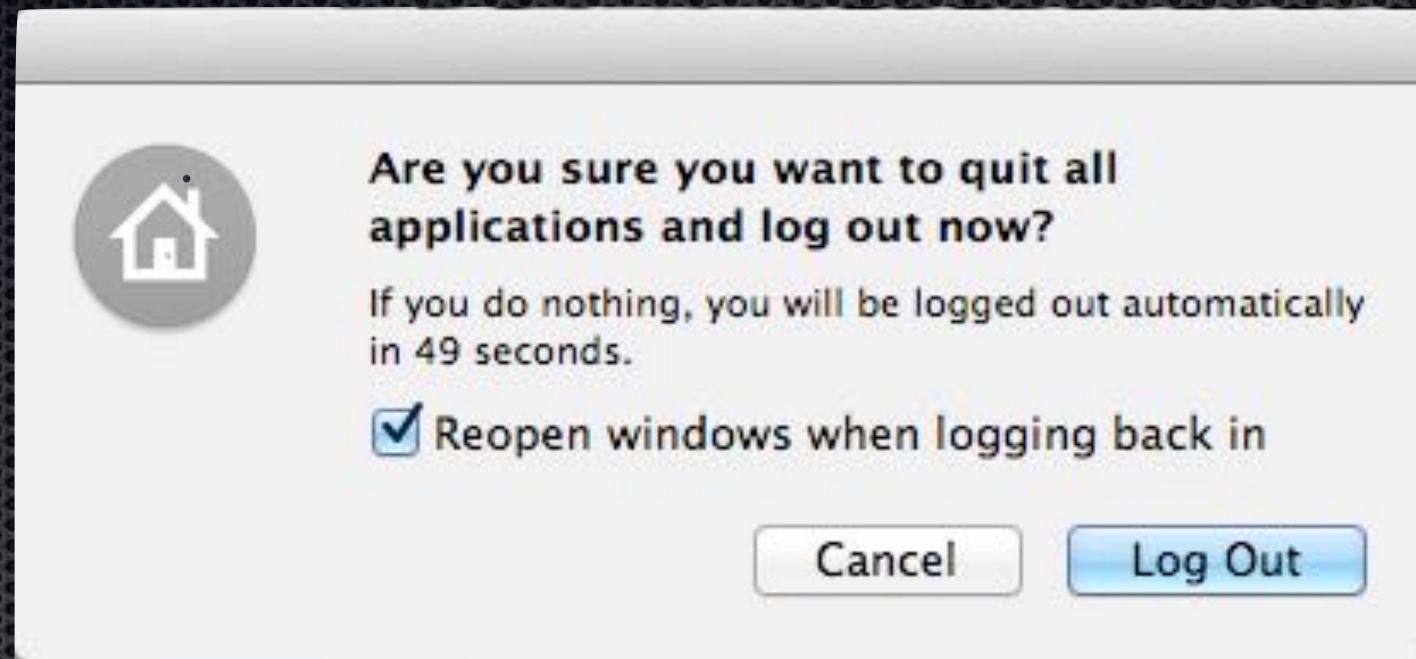




# Gestures for Navigation

We can see the various gestures in the Trackpad system preferences.





# Resume

Allows you to resume your applications and open documents just as you left them before logging out or restarting your Mac.





# Auto-Save and Versions

Auto-save and versions work with Time Machine to keep incremental changes in your work.

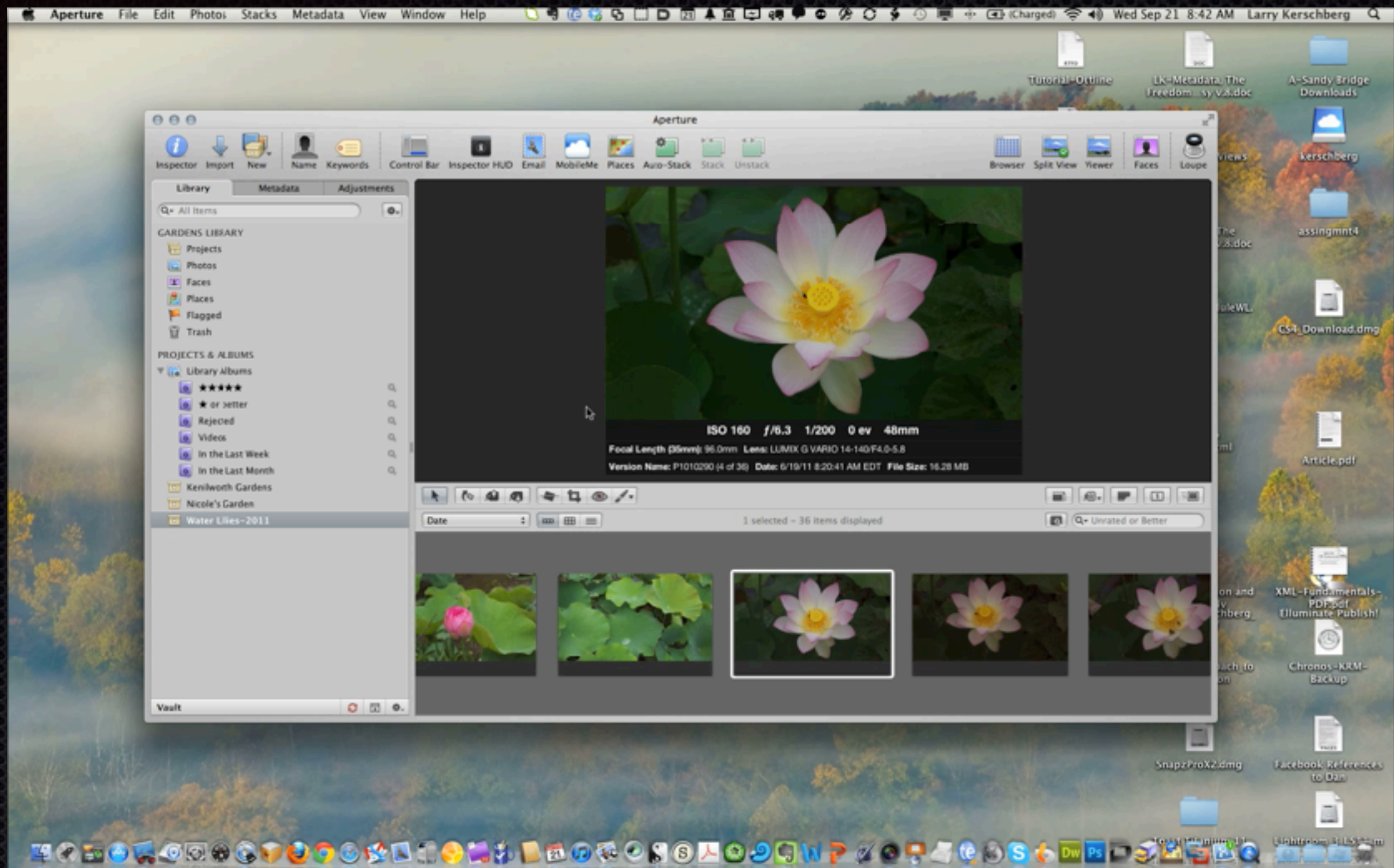


# App Store

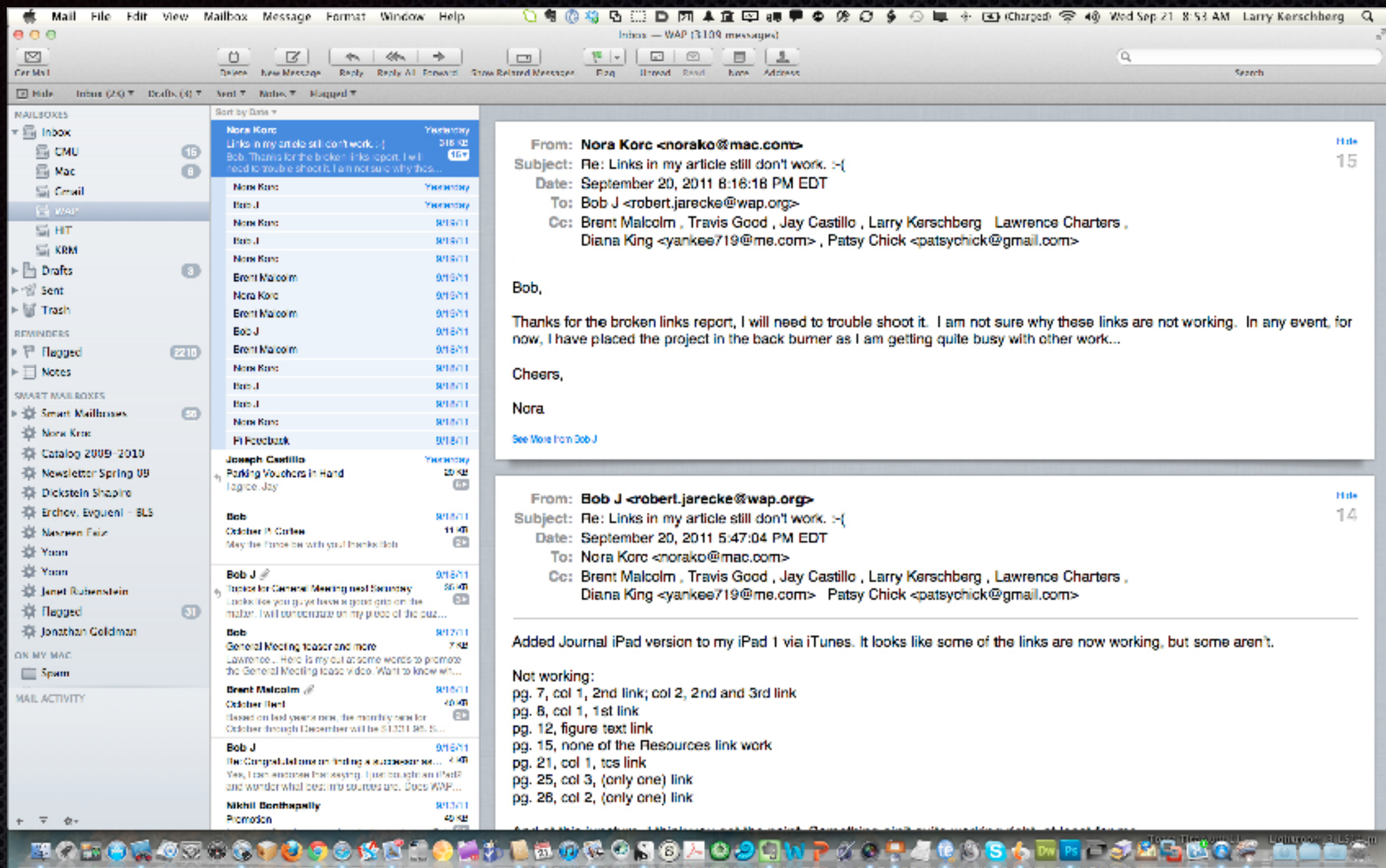




# Full Screen Apps

I love the conversation view, iPad-like auto-correct, and enhanced search.

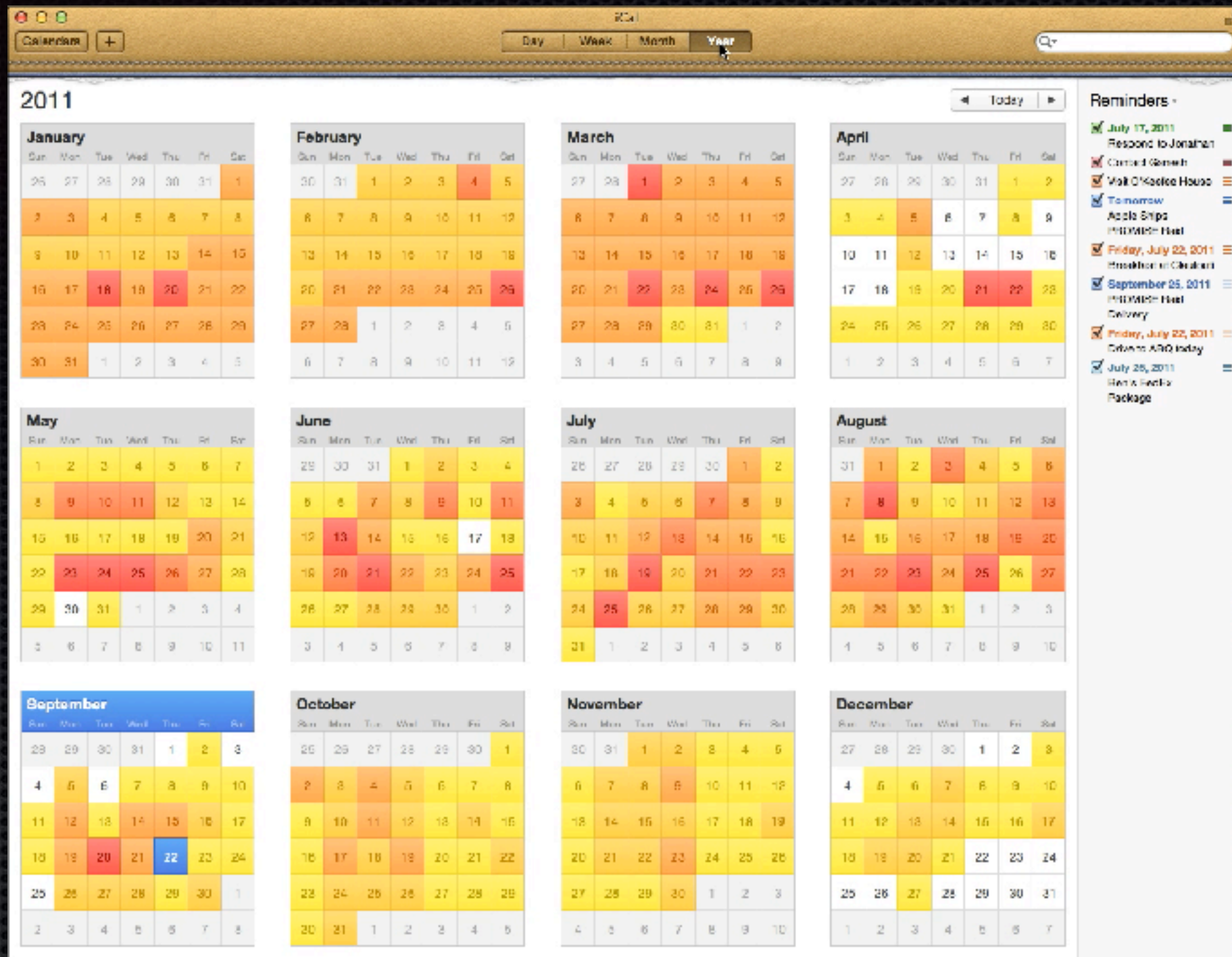




# Safari
